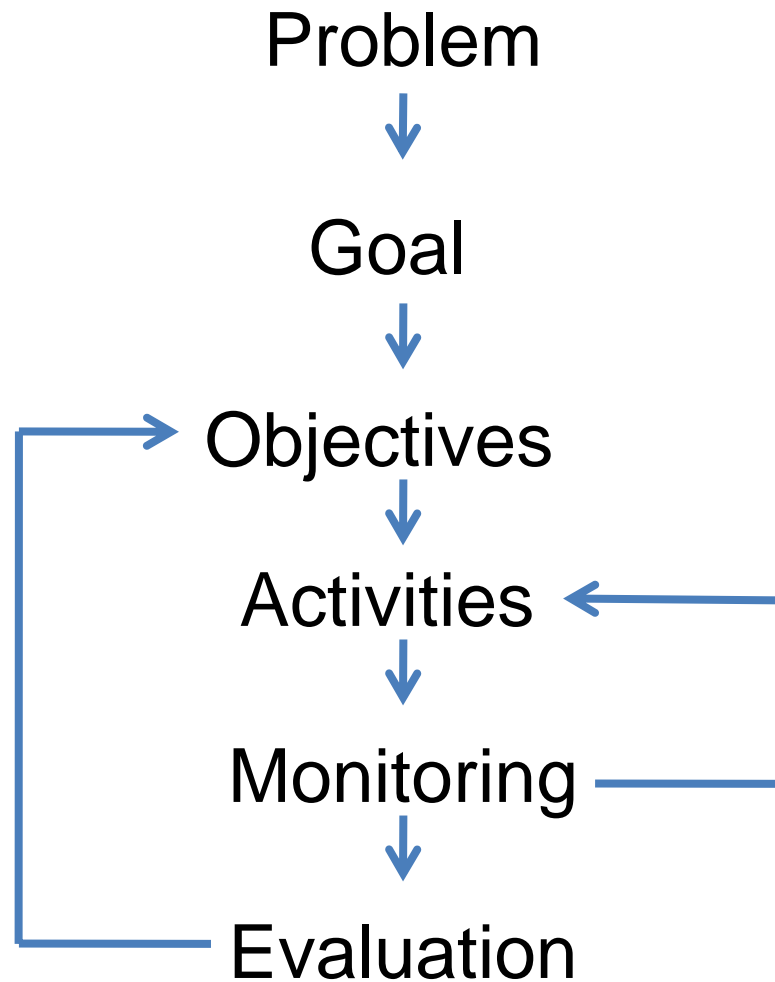

Planning Cycle



Monitoring

- Uses routine data to assess implementation of activities
- A continuous management function
- Useful to compare frequently looking for small changes

Evaluation

- Activity to assess progress towards achieving objectives
- An intermittent function
- Combines routine monitoring data with additional data collection that may include both quantitative and qualitative methods

Purpose of Indicators

Indicators are used both in monitoring and evaluation

Indicators are classified in different ways

- Structural, Process, Outcome and Impact indicators
- Inputs, Outputs, Outcomes & Impact indicators
- Leading, Lagging and Coincident indicators

When selecting monitoring indicators consider immediate use for management decision making and detecting problems early
